MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

UNIVERSIDAD NACIONAL DE CORDOBA (ARGENTINA)

AND

ANGELO STATE UNIVERSITY (USA)

Angelo State University (ASU), located in San Angelo, Texas and represented by its President **Ronnie D. Hawkins, Jr., Lt. Gen (ret), USAF**, and **Universidad Nacional de Cordoba (UNC)** domiciled at Av. Raúl Haya de la Torre s/n, second floor, Pabellón Argentina, Ciudad Universitaria, City of Córdoba, Argentina, represented by its Rector Mgter. Jhon Boretto; hereby agree to institute and implement a cooperation n exchange program between the two institutions for the following purposes deemed to be mutually beneficial to both parties:

- (1) the exchange of students, faculty, and administrative/professional staff for full-time study, teaching, or professional development;
- (2) cooperation in joint research projects;
- (3) the exchange of information and academic expertise in the development of academic programs at one or both institutions;
- (4) cooperation on special projects to promote the economic/cultural linkage between San Angelo and Cordoba, Argentina.

A. Exchange of faculty and administrative/professional staff.

A program of exchange for faculty and administrative/professional staff will be established. Details of exchanges will be worked out on an individual basis by representatives of the appropriate academic departments at UNC and ASU. The duration of these exchanges may be for one year, one semester, or shorter periods as determined by mutual consent of the appropriate administrators at both institutions.

Subject to available funding, the two schools will endeavor to provide office space, clerical help,



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and access to libraries and other departmental and university facilities to visiting faculty, as well as assistance in securing visas and housing accommodation on or near the campuses.

B. Exchange of Students.

By mutual agreement, ASU and UNC may implement several kinds of student exchange programs: semester, full-year, and special short-term courses of study focusing on the language and culture of the host institution. Students from each institution may attend the other institution in accordance with the following general guidelines:

1. As far as possible, during an academic year, the number of students exchanged shall be equal. The total number of students to be exchanged in a given academic year will be determined by mutual consent of the International Programs officers / Course Directors of both institutions, with a maximum of 4 students per academic year for each party.
2. The home institution will screen and select its own applicants for the exchange program and submit all necessary application materials to the host institution by the application deadline. Students must meet all admission requirements of the host institution in order to be accepted for the exchange program. For Angelo State University, incoming students must have completed at least one year of full time study at the home institution to be eligible for the exchange program.
3. For admission to regular semester course work, students must exhibit satisfactory proficiency in the language of instruction at the host institution. Language proficiency requirements will be determined by the host institution. For Angelo State University, incoming students must speak English at a B2 level. In the case of Universidad Nacional de Córdoba, incoming students must speak Spanish at a B2 level (intermediate level).
4. Exchange students shall continue to pay tuition to their home institution during the period of exchange, where applicable. The host institution shall not require tuition fees of exchange students. (Students may, however, be required to pay fees for special services, e.g. health insurance, identity cards, use of certain facilities. When possible, special service fees shall be waived by the host institution).
5. All exchange students must register and pay tuition and required fees at the home institution prior to departure on the exchange program.
6. Each institution will assist the students accepted for the exchange program in finding accommodation.



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7. The host institution will provide all necessary documents for visa purposes. Students will be responsible for obtaining visas once they have received the necessary documents. Students will also be responsible for the following:

- (a) transportation to and from the host institution
- (b) textbooks, class materials, clothing, and personal expenses
- (c) passports and visa costs
- (d) health insurance
- (e) housing costs
- (f) living expenses including local transportation costs

8. All academic credit will be awarded by the home institution. The host institution will provide the home institution with a transcript of each student's work within a reasonable time after the completion of the exchange program.

C. Individual and Joint Research Programs.

The two parties will examine the possibilities of cooperating in research programs directed by individuals or by teams. This may involve exchange of staff or visits to share information and discuss project strategy. Each school will endeavor to provide suitable facilities for research.

D. Curriculum Development Projects.

The two parties will cooperate on the enhancement of existing academic programs and the development of new programs at one or both schools as determined by mutual consent.

E. Language/Culture Programs.

Opportunities will be explored for special language/culture programs for faculty and staff at each institution.

F. Economic/Cultural Linkages.

The parties will seek opportunities to establish and enhance linkages between business and cultural organizations in San Angelo and Cordoba.

G. Grantseeking.



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The two institutions will undertake, individually and jointly, to identify external sources of support for joint projects.

H. Dispute Settlement

This memorandum is an expression of goodwill on both sides. Problems that might arise due to interpretation, fulfilment or further development of the agreement, shall be solved by mutual agreement.

I. Commencement, Duration, and Termination of the agreement.

After signing, this agreement will become effective for a period of five (5) years, after which the agreement will be tacitly renewed for one year each year, until terminated by one of the parties. Termination of the agreement will take effect six months after notice has been served by one party expressing the desire to end collaboration.

This memorandum is drawn up in two (2) original copies in the English language and in the Spanish Language, each Contracting Party receiving one (1) duly signed copy hereof in each language.
